#### **Action Items:**

#### Tami Sufi with TOOLE Design Group Presented on the Safe Routes to School Plan

This presentation looked at improving multimodal transportation opportunities and increasing access, safety, and convenience for all road users. The "Safe Routes to School" plan is aware of the importance of youth travel, not only to and from school, but daily. This project represents a collaboration within the community (including USD 501, Topeka Public Schools) to build on past efforts to improve the quality of life for Topeka residents of all ages. All 14 "open" elementary schools in USD 501 were examined; and policy, programming, and infrastructure improvements for each school were assessed. Details about each school were provided in an individual site plan.

The elementary schools recognized the following as some of the biggest challenges:

Lack of Crossing Guards

Some neighborhood streets lack sidewalks

Poor Maintenance of Sidewalks/curb ramps

Crossings lack high visibility markings/ Need fresh paint

Adjacent arterials and collectors create challenges

Infrastructure issues are exacerbated by congestion at drop of/pick up areas

Inadequate bike infrastructure/bike parking

Lack of existing organizational structure for Safe Routes to School

Safety

Mr. Riphahn asked how the information was collected. Ms. Sufi stated that there was a combination of things including talking to the principals, surveys of parents/caregivers, and data collection. Ms. Sufi said there were teams of about two-three that went to each school.

Ms. Ortiz inquired about the lack of crossing guards, and the fact that they have been out of use for a long time. Mr. Miller stated that he has never seen a crossing guard. Ms. Hiller stated this was a question for the school district.

Ms. Hiller felt that the presentation is great, however, the wrong people are attending the meeting. Ms. Hiller asked if Toole had reached out to the schools. Ms. Sufi agreed stated that the city could provide some resources, but the school district needs to be involved.

Mr. Riphahn asked if there was any data along the Shunga Trail, and if the kids use it to get to school. Ms. Sufi stated there was not any detailed data regarding kids using the trail, as they primarily focused on drop off/pick up area. There was a half mile radius around the school, which is the typical walking/biking distance.

Ms. Ricketts-Wolfe asked about the clarity of some of the pages in the presentation. Ms. Sufi stated that they could provide the overall priority list. Ms. Ricketts-Wolfe asked about a handful of recommendations from some "drop-off/pick -up studies" done by the engineering staff, and how Toole would be presenting that information. Ms. Sufi stated that they could add that information into the appendix, as those schools had more detailed reports.

Ms. Hiller asked about ADA crossings, which were installed within the last 10 years, that were noted as incompliant and wondered if the city did something wrong. Ms. Sufi stated that that guidelines were recently updated, so the city didn't do anything wrong. The other factor is maintainance and curb ramps.

Mr. Miller asked how much training needed to be done for a crossing guard? Ms. Sufi stated that although crossing guard training is not her expertise; there might be a short webinar that can be watched. The other factor is making sure there is proper equipment. Mr. Miller suggested maybe the City could work together with the schools to ensure low cost for them, but are able to get kids safely to school.

Motion by Mr. Riphahn, seconded by Mr. Miller to accept this plan of the Safe Routes to School as the final draft. Approved 6-0

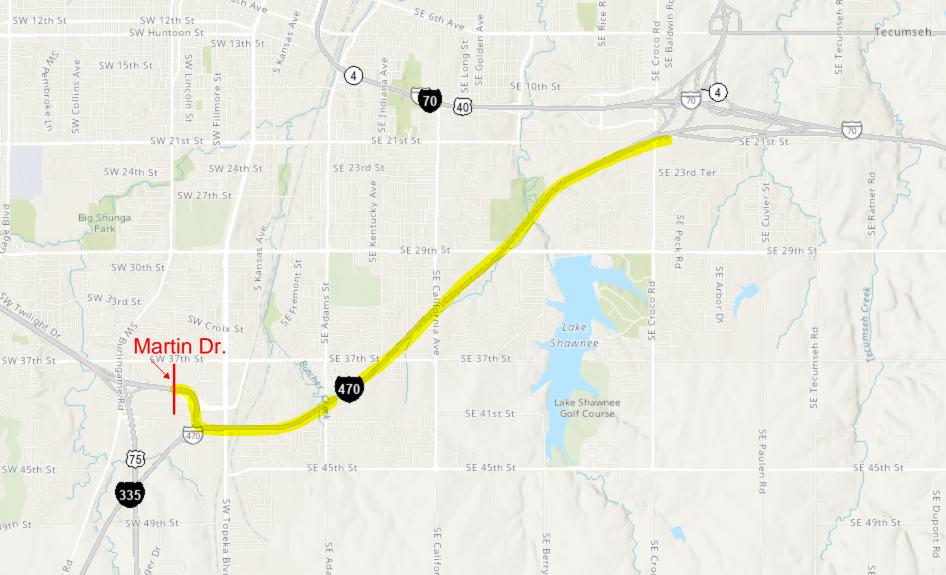
